CLASS RULES:

- All cow horse, herd, and boxing classes follow NRCHA procedures & scoring rules
- Ranch Riding will follow AQHA rules
- Limited rules on equipment as long as it is safe – see additional information
- See Additional Information for division definitions

DRAWS:

 All draws are done at 6pm the evening before **Drops made after 6pm will be charged all fees **Adds after 6pm will go at the end of the class

CLASS FEES:

All-In Blanket Fee: \$650 / horse, includes single stall & cattle fees – may enter unlimited classes / multiple divisions for no additional charge *Shavings, Tack Stall, Camping, Office Fee are additional

Individual Fees:

Herd Work - \$125 Cow Horse (Rein / Fence) - \$150 Boxing (Rein / Box) - \$125 Ranch Riding - \$30

Single Stall - \$100

Double Stall - \$140 or \$40 added to blanket fee

Shavings - \$10 / ea (2 bag min must be purchased onsite)

Camping - \$120 / weekend



Additional Information:

- This show is intended as an introduction for those who are wanting to try reined cow horse the goal is a fun, friendly, and affordable show!
- A second show is planned for January 23-25th, 2026
- Circuit awards will be awarded for each division based on the results of the two shows
- No paybacks for any of the classes
- Cow practice time on Saturday morning is complimentary with NRCHA rider Ryan
 Gallentine sign-up at the gate. Entries will be capped to start the show on time, but a horse / rider may go multiple times if time allows
- Equipment must be safe and humane, but otherwise rules are limited to allow flexibility based on level of horse and rider. A horse may be shown in snaffle/hackamore or bridle, regardless of age. Split reins, chain curb strap, etc. are allowed. Two hands may be used in a bridle in any class. Please check with the office if you have questions.
- All horses must be stalled no jump outs are allowed
- All horses must have a negative Coggins on file with the office
- Cross-entry is allowed across divisions, provided a rider meets the requirements. A horse may only go in a class 1x (i.e. cannot have 2 riders on the same horse in the same class)
- Division Definitions:
 - Open Classes: open to any rider
 - Non-Pro Classes:
 - Rider must not have earned remuneration from training, giving lessons, or judging horse related events in the last 3 years
 - See NRCHA rules for any additional clarification on Non-Pro definition
 - Novice Non-Pro Classes:
 - Rider must meet non-pro requirements
 - Rider may not have won more than \$1,000 in NRCHA
 - Sliding stops are not judged (no sliders required)
 - Youth Classes: 18&U as of January 1st of the calendar year
